A NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

I first encountered and fell in love with Pat McCabe's The Butcher Boy as a junior in high school. Immediately, I was struck by the natural musicality of Francie's voice, and from that incredible first line I knew exactly how his world sounded. In many ways, I think Francie was always meant for the stage. He is a showman, an impressionist; he is unrestrained by reality. The time and place of his story also allowed me to pay homage to a lot of my cultural touchstones: horror and sci-fi of the 50's, the old Look and Learn magazines my Dad kept from his childhood and shared with me, and of course the many musicals of my youth that shaped me as a writer. This show has held a huge place in my heart for the past 6 years, and I am eternally grateful to Charlotte and Ciarán for giving me the opportunity to share it. I'm so thrilled to invite you into Francie's world. It is a world of escapism, of heroism, of play, a world amalgamated from the characters on TV and in the pages of comic books. It's a world you may understand a little better after the past few years, when most of our interaction with other humans was filtered through an assortment of screens, but in the end it is unequivocally Francie's world. We're all just living in it.

PATRICK McCABE (Author of Original Novel) Playwright and novelist Patrick McCabe was born in 1955 in County Monaghan, Ireland. He was educated at St Patrick's Training College, Dublin and taught at Kingsbury Day Special School, London. McCabe has published several novels, including The Butcher Boy (1992), which won the Irish Times Irish Literature Prize for Fiction and was shortlisted for the Booker Prize for Fiction; The Dead School (1995), an account of the misfortunes that befall two Dublin teachers; Breakfast on Pluto (1998), the disturbing tale of a transvestite prostitute who becomes involved with Republican terrorists, also shortlisted for a

Booker Prize; Emerald Germs of Ireland (2001), a black comedy featuring matricide Pat McNab and his attempts to fend off nosy neighbors; and Winterwood (2006), named the 2007 Hughes & Hughes/Irish Independent Irish Novel of the Year. His latest novels are The Holy City (2008) and The Stray Sod Country (2010). He is also the author of a children's book. The Adventures of Shay Mouse (1985), and a collection of linked short stories. Mondo Desperado. published in 1999. His play Frank Pig Says Hello, which he adapted from The Butcher Boy, was first performed at the Dublin Theatre Festival in 1992. His short stories have been published in the Irish Times and the Cork Examiner and his work has been broadcast by RTÉ in Ireland and the BBC. He now lives in Sligo in Ireland with his wife and two daughters.

ASHER MULDOON (Book, Music, and Lyrics) is a writer, actor, and comedian based in NYC. He is a rising senior at Princeton University, pursuing a degree in English with a certificate in Music Theater. A Letter from the Director

Pat McCabe's modern classic took the literary world by storm when it was released in 1992. It was adapted shortly afterwards into the play, Frank Pig Says Hello, which Irish Rep co-produced in our first season on West 22nd Street.

I was born and raised in a small town about 30 miles from where The Butcher Boy is set. In a country where the dreary weather and the penal rubrics of the Catholic church informed every phase of Irish life, I witnessed how the newly arrived television awoke our consciousness and offered an escape from our sins. Sodden fields and bogs became the Wild West and the small villages of Ireland transformed into Gotham begging for protection. Batman and The Lone Ranger trawled the countryside saving the lives of desperate cows. Hi-Yo Silver, Away!

When Asher Muldoon approached us with an exciting new take on the sad and shocking story of Francie Brady, I was immediately hooked.

Welcome to The Butcher Boy, the musical.
