He's been honored by the National Academy of Television Arts and Sciences with fifteen Emmy Award nominations, winning six. And he was honored with the prestigious Peabody Award for his work on "48 HOURS." The publisher of Bikeman, Andrews/McMeel. released а Commemorative Edition to mark the 20th anniversary of 9/11. Flynn is married to Nancy Reardon with whom he co-wrote On Camera. They split their time between New York City and Cape Cod. Their daughter Kate and her husband Marc Mewshaw, live in Brooklyn.

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
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
