DYLAN THOMAS (*Author*) was born in Swansea, a seacoast town in southern Wales, on October 27, 1914. After dropping out of school at sixteen, he worked as a junior reporter on the South Wales Evening

Post. In addition to poetry, Thomas wrote short stories, radio plays, and film scripts. He is best known for the radio play *Under Milk Wood* and the poem "Do Not Go Gentle into That Good Night," composed in 1951, in honor of his dying father. Throughout his career, Thomas conducted a renowned series of reading tours of the United States. During his fourth American lecture tour, and a few days after his thirty-ninth birthday, he collapsed in his New York hotel. Thomas died on November 9, 1953, at St. Vincent's Hospital. His body was returned to Wales, where a simple wooden cross marks his grave.

Charlotte was named "Director of the Year" by The Wall Street Journal in 2011. Charlotte has been inducted in to the Irish America Hall of Fame and awarded the Presidential Distinguished Service Award for the Irish Abroad in 2019 by President of Ireland, Michael D. Higgins.

JOHN BELL (Music Supervisor) is currently the Associate Music Director of the hit Broadway revival of Into the Woods at the St. James Theatre. At Irish Rep, he has been the music director/supervisor for On A Clear Day You Can See Forever, Finian's Rainbow, Meet Me in St. Louis (virtual and live productions), Donnybrook, New Girl in Town, Transport, A Child's Christmas in Wales, and their gala concerts since 2014. GLOSSARY

BACH

A word meaning small or little, but also used as 'dear', commonly used after a name as a term of endearment, e.g. "Dylan bach..."

CAWL

A traditional Welsh soup, typically made with beef, lamb, or bacon with seasonal vegetables. In modern Welsh, the word "cawl" is sued to describe any soup or broth.

COCKLES

Cockles are small clams, often raked up on the Welsh coast and eaten alongside laverbread and bacon as part of a traditional Welsh breakfast.

CRAIG

The Welsh word "craig" directly translates to "rock."

LAVERBREAD

Fun fact: Laver bread is not bread! Welsh laverbread is actually cooked seaweed from the Welsh coast known as laver. Today, it is a delicacy, described by Richard Burton as 'Welshman's caviar'.

SOUL CAKE

Soul cakes are small round spiced cakes made to celebrate and commemorate the dead around the traditional time of Samhain.

WELSHCAKES

Flat, circular, sweet traditional bread cakes.
