



SAMUEL BECKETT (Playwright) (1906-1989) Samuel Beckett was an Irish playwright, writer, poet, and director born in Dublin on Good Friday, April 13, 1906. He lived in Paris for much of his life and wrote in both English and French. Beckett penned plays, novels, short stories, poems, and French English translations. His best-known plays include Waiting for Godot and Endgame. Beckett received the Croix de Guerre and the Médaille de la Résistance for his participation in the French Resistance during World War II. His writing earned him a number of awards, including the 1969 Nobel Prize for Literature.

A Letter from the Directors

This marks Irish Repertory Theatre's second production of *Endgame* by Samuel Beckett. The first was staged in 2005 starring Tony Roberts, Adam Heller, Kathryn Grody, and the legendary Alvin Epstein.

In 1958, Mr. Epstein played Clov in Endgame's American Premiere.

During that year, Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev demanded that the Western powers remove themselves from West Berlin. The threat of nuclear annihilation was in the air. Audiences watching Samuel Beckett's *Endgame* in 1958 felt the clear and present danger of a world on the brink and saw a vision of that destruction on the stage.

In 2005, Al Gore's documentary, *An Inconvenient Truth* was being filmed for release. It was the year of tsunamis and hurricanes, and an awareness of global warming was sinking into our collective consciousness. Patrons watching Endgame might have imagined a planet that had melted.

In 2023, we can take our pick of scenarios.

We are still emerging from a world plague that locked down the planet; our nervous eyes are watching Ukraine and the dark forces that seek its domination; there are floods and fires and nuclear waste.

As we sit in the dark theatre and imagine what lies beyond the crumbling walls of this home where the last vestiges of humanity play out their "final" hours, what strikes us is the timelessness of Beckett's bleak vision.

What also emerges from the fissured cracks is the indomitable human spirit that continues to say in Beckett's immortal words:

"You must go on. I can't go on. I'll go on."

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




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
