MELISSA ERRICO (Mrs. Patrick Campbell) is a Tony-nominated Broadway star, recording artist and author. A woman of stage, screen and song, she has become

one of the polestars of the American musical theater; equally celebrated for her concert and cabaret performances, as well as her award-winning recordings. She has long been a member of the Irish Rep where she starred in Oscar Wilde's Importance of Being Earnest and in George Bernard Shaw's Major Barbara and Candida. Over the years, she has starred in three versions of Harburg & Lane's Finian's Rainbow, for the Rep, with the third, in 2016, prompting her debut piece as a writer for the New York Times, beginning a series the Times calls "Scenes from An Acting Life," wry and illuminating takes on the performers' existence. (She, like Mrs. Campbell, suggested she was too old for her role.) After Camelot with Jeremy Irons. Oliver! and Brigadoon, Melissa's most recent musical production here at the Rep was On a Clear Day You Can See Forever which prompted her to write an essay on gender politics in the mid-century musical. Broadway: My Fair Lady (Eliza Doolittle), High Society, White Christmas, Dracula, Amour (Tony-nominee for Best Actress), Anna Karenina, Les Miserables. Sondheim: Sunday In The Park (Kennedy Center), Passion (CSC), Do I Hear a Waltz? (City Center). She has six Drama Desk Award noms. Her recordings including Sondheim Sublime ("the best all-Sondheim recording ever recorded"- The Wall Street Journal), her

symphonic Legrand Affair, and her latest release Out of The Dark: The Film Noir Project, which won this year's Bistro Award as Concept Album of the Year. Soon, she tours Paris for concerts to be broadcast by Radio France, Montreal (with George Benson), and London with the Ronnie Scott's lazz Band, melissaerrico.com



DAVID STALLER (George Bernard Shaw) is the founding artistic director of New York City's Gingold Theatrical Group, now in its 18th year. He directed the acclaimed

Off-Broadway productions of Bernard Shaw's Candida, Mrs. Warren's Profession, Caesar and Cleopatra, Heartbreak House, Man and Superman, Major Barbara, You Never Can Tell, and Widowers' Houses (all filmed by the NYPL at Lincoln Center). His production of Candida will be streamed online later this year. He oversees all of GTG's programs, (including the SPEAKERS' CORNER New Play Development Program, PROJECT SHAW reading series at Symphony Space, and several partnerships with NYC schools), has produced and directed many plays and special events around the world, and is frequently invited upon the international theatre as an activist speaker about equal human rights and all things Shaw. He has directed performances of all of Shaw's 65 plays, acted in London, in three Broadway and almost fifty Off-Broadway plays, and twice performed as a soloist at Carnegie Hall. Member: SDC, AEA. SAG/AFTRA.

JEROME KILTY (*Playwright*) (1922-2012) forged a distinguished career in the theatre. Over the years, he received many significant awards as a playwright and actor, including the Critics Circle Award for Best Actor in 1985 and a Joseph Jefferson Award for his role as Harry Hope in the Goodman's production of The Iceman Cometh. He appeared The Balcony (Bolshoi Theatre) and King Lear (ART Cambridge). Since his New York debut in The Relapse, he became internationally known as a playwright, director, and actor. He performed in Broadway and regional several productions, taught acting and directing at Harvard, and directed and performed in many productions of Dear Liar. He wrote a few "letter plays": Dear Liar, Dear Love, and Look Away to name a few.

GEORGE BERNARD SHAW (Playwright) (1856-1950) Born in Dublin in 1856, Shaw brought plays animated by ideas to the London stage. With his radical rationalism, disregard for convention, keen debate, and verbal wit, he mocked the frivolous comedies of the Victorians. He was fiercely proud of being a freethinking humanist who championed human rights. Shaw's extraordinary energy is evident not only in the amount he wrote but in how he lived his life. As a lecturer, he began as "an arrant coward, nervous and self-conscious to a heartrending degree" and transformed dazzling orator. into His correspondences with women had the intensity of love affairs, but it was not until 1898 that he married Charlotte Payne-Townshend, a fellow socialist. He was awarded a Nobel Prize (1925) for his contribution to literature and an Oscar (1938) for his Pygmalion screenplay. He encouraged everyone to forge individual paths in life, taking responsibility for their choices. It is challenging to separate Shaw from G.B.S.. caricature of himself he invented. Asked in his seventies to explain his creation, Shaw wrote: "I was complicated by a deeper strangeness, which has made me all my life a sojourner on this planet rather than a native of it. I was at home only in the realm of my imagination. Therefore I had to become an actor, and create for myself a fantastic personality fit and apt for dealing with men, and adaptable to the various parts I had to play as an author, journalist, orator, politician, committee man, man of the world." Shaw died at the age of 94 on November 2, 1950.

MRS. PATRICK CAMPBELL (Actress) (1865-1940) Beatrice Stella Campbell, known for her stage name as Mrs. Patrick Campbell, was a noted English stage actress. Remembered today for her association with George Bernard Shaw, she was an actress of wit, charm and beauty. She made her theatrical debut in 1888 and achieved success in 1893 in the title role of Pinero's Second Mrs. Tanqueray. She created many classic roles, including Eliza Doolittle in George Bernard Shaw's Pygmalion, a play written for her.

On a Clear Day You Can See Forever, Three Small Irish Masterpieces by W.B. Yeats, Lady Gregory and J.M. Synge. New York premiere of Brian Friel's The Home Place, World premiere of Larry Kirwan's Rebel in the Soul, Finian's Rainbow, The Phyllis Newman Women's Health Initiative gala, Truman Capote's A Christmas Memory, Juno and the Paycock and Dancing at Lughnasa. New York stage appearances include A Perfect Ganesh, Meet Me in St. Louis, The Perfect Party, Morning's at Seven, Private Lives (with Elizabeth Taylor and Richard Burton), and many performances with the New York Shakespeare Festival. Ms. Moore has received two Tony Award nominations, the Outer Critics Circle Award, the Drama Desk Award, the Drama League Award, the Irish America Top 100 Irish Award, The Eugene O'Neill Lifetime Achievement Award, and the 2008 Irish Women Of The Year Award. She is the recipient of the St. Patrick's Committee in Holyoke's John F. Kennedy National Award, and has thrice been listed as one of the "Top 50 Power Women" in Irish America Magazine. Charlotte was named "Director of the Year" by The Wall Street Journal in 2011. Charlotte has been inducted in to the Irish America Hall of Fame and awarded the Presidential Distinguished Service Award for the Irish Abroad in 2019 by President of Ireland, Michael D. Higgins.

Ciarán has been inducted in to the Irish America Hall of Fame and has been awarded the Presidential Distinguished Service Award for the Irish Abroad, 2019 by President of Ireland, Michael D. Higgins.
