


As a model, Brooke has graced the covers of hundreds of magazines. most notably Time Magazine as the "Face of the Eighties." Shields has maintained successful and critically acclaimed television and theatre careers. She is the best-selling author of several books. including the critically acclaimed Down Came the Rain: My Journey Through Postpartum Depression. Brooke was recently the subject of the Emmy-nominated documentary Pretty Baby: Brooke Shields. Her latest entrepreneurial project Commence (formerly BIN) inspires women over 40 to live their best lives with beauty and wellness products developed for the challenges that arise during this period. She also hosts her hit iHeart podcast Now What? With Brooke Shields, featuring insightful conversations with a variety of different guests. Shields recently announced an upcoming book, currently untitled, that promises to explore the humility and power of aging. She can next be seen opposite Benjamin Bratt in the upcoming Netflix film Mother of the Bride. In addition to her professional career. Brooke continues to be a strong advocate for women's issues and keeping the arts alive in schools. She is a happily married mother of two strong and intelligent daughters.

A Letter from the Directors

When A.R. Gurney first wrote *Love Letters*, he had, at the suggestion of his literary agent, submitted it to *The New Yorker* for their consideration. He was stunned when he received a swift response rejecting the work. His surprise wasn't in the quick rebuff, but in the reason for the rejection. They said, "Sorry, we don't publish plays."

The New Yorker's letter was news to Pete because he hadn't written it as a play. It was an "epistolary novel."

And then he thought, wait a minute, maybe they're right...

And it turned out they were. *Love Letters'* circuitous route to the stage gave A.R. Gurney, already a revered and prolific playwright as well as a Pulitzer Prize finalist for Drama, more productions than any of his other plays.

Letters have been around for a while. Of the 27 books in the Bible, 21 of them are letters. These days, social media posts might be considered letters — with many likes and shares from the Corinthians and the Romans!

Pete gives us two fictional characters in this play whose exchanges span from 1937 to 1985, before cellphones, before texts, before Twitter – just a pen in cursive letters and two thumping hearts.
